Read customer reviews carefully. If they appear overly positive or have generic language with repeated patterns, they may be fake.

Check for urgency cues like countdown timers that pressure quick decisions. Legitimate sellers should provide ample time for you to consider your purchase.

Inspect the site's domain for unusual characters like extra hyphens or random strings. A suspicious domain often indicates a scam.
